

Lauren Mabry

Originally from Madison, Wisconsin, Lauren Mabry received her BFA in ceramics from Kansas City Art Institute in 2007 and her MFA from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 2012. She has held numerous national and international residencies, at the Archie Bray Foundation for Ceramic Arts in Montana, the Clay Studio of Philadelphia, in Jingdezhen, China, and most recently in Bali, Indonesia. In 2014, she was awarded a Pew Fellowship in the Arts and the Emerging Artist Award by the National Council on Education for Ceramic Arts. Her work has been exhibited widely and is included in the permanent collections of the Daum Museum of Contemporary Art (Missouri), Sheldon Museum of Art (Nebraska), Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art (Kansas) and Archie Bray Foundation for Ceramic Arts (Montana). She currently lives and works in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
