Biophilia

March 13 through April 30, 2025

Greenwich, CT – The Flinn Gallery will host an opening reception for *Biophilia* on Thursday, March 13, from 6-8pm. *Biophilia* features the work of six artists: Carol Bouyoucos, Loren Eiferman, Julie Evans, Heide Follin, Christina Massey, and Sui Park. Curated by Ellen Hawley, the show explores the concept of biophilia, a term coined by Harvard naturalist Dr. Edward O. Wilson, referring to humanity’s intrinsic affinity for nature and life. Drawing inspiration from both real and imagined aspects of the natural world, these artists express reinterpreted landscapes and life forms through a dynamic range of materials, textures, and colors.

Featured Artists:

- **Carol Bouyoucos** combines photography and digital tools to create vibrant, surreal landscapes that evoke a romanticized nature.
- **Loren Eiferman** transforms felled wood into intricate sculptures inspired by 15th century plant forms from *The Voynich Manuscript*, while weaving a conversation about ecological healing with her series *Nature Will Heal*.
- **Julie Evans** bridges the familiar and the unfamiliar with organic ceramic sculptures.
- **Heide Follin** explores ecosystems and unseen energies through layered botanical imagery on canvas, fabric, and wood.
- **Christina Massey**’s uses repurposed aluminum cans to create colorful, abstract works that live somewhere between that of painting and sculpture, craft and fine art, process-based and conceptual.
- **Sui Park** manipulates industrial materials like plastic zip ties to form dynamic, biomorphic sculptures that reflect nature’s subtle transformations.

Additional programming includes an Artist Talk on Sunday, March 30 at 2pm; a Friends Friday Film tie-in on April 11; and an Innovation Lab project creating a 3D printed lamp. Registration and more details for these programs will be announced. The Flinn Gallery is a non-profit organization sponsored by Friends of Greenwich Library and is located on the second floor of the Library at 101 Putnam Avenue, Greenwich, CT.
